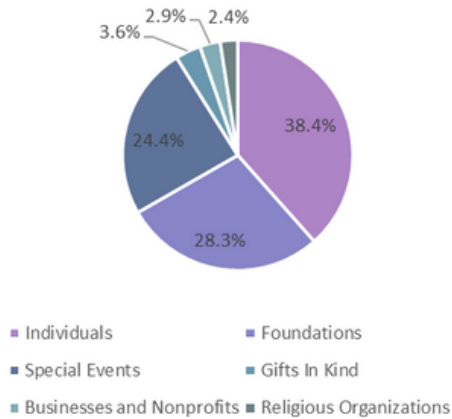

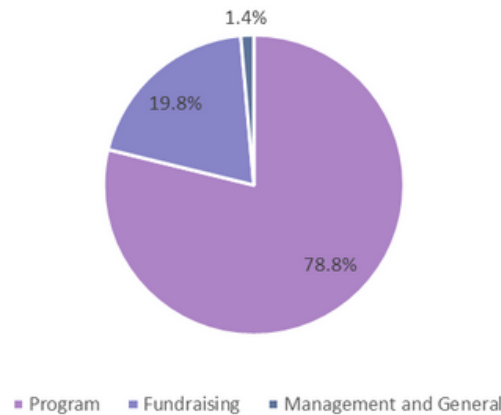
2022 Sources of Revenue
