Exciting Vews!

We closed on a second location! The new location is a convent in a residential neighborhood in East Irondequoit, nestled in a community in close proximity to schools and houses of worship. It will allow us to grow from serving 10 women and children to 30 women and children, helping tremendously with our waitlist!

The first floor will house the living room, kitchen, and common areas. The second floor will house mothers within their first two years of the program. And the third floor will offer transitional housing - more independence - yet, if needed, support remains just a floor below.

Lucia, originally from Mexico, moved to the US at age 12. Bilingual with a background in physical therapy and medical interpreting, her true passion lies in working as a Case Manager (also referred to as Navigator).

She joined The Margaret Home in February, drawn to its mission and the flexibility it offers to care for her baby, Dominic. As Navigator, Lucia works part-time supporting mothers and their children.



She meets weekly with each mom to track progress toward personal, educational, and career goals, offering tools like personality and career assessments and baby development resources. She also assists with scheduling and onboarding volunteers.
